Greetings

to you all from David and Debbie Bolos and our family, the Peruvian Christians and the children of New Hope in the precious name of our LORD and Savior Jesus Christ! - **When my father and mother forsake me, than the Lord will take me up... (Ps. 27:10)** This verse never meant more to me than it does now. I remember some time ago when we first began New Hope Children's Home, I walked into the little girls dorm here at our Home. I remember one special little girl that we had recently taken in... she was barely 7 years old and had been abandoned by both her parents. I remember how she had taken some colored paper and cut out some letters and hung them above her bed. The words she chose to hang up were Ps. 27:10... **WHEN MY FATHER AND MOTHER FORSAKE ME, THAN THE LORD WILL TAKE ME UP...** I will never forget how my heart broke for a child abandoned and left by her mom and dad, but I also will never forget thinking how great the grace of our Lord is, how

infinite His love is, and how gentle He treats his children! This little girl is now 20 years old, she worked for nearly 2 years after graduating from High-School in our daughter's orphanage in Lima, and is now married a Godly man... together they serve our Lord faithfully! Truly our Lord is the Father of the fatherless; He is the Defender of the poor and needy... for He has proven this time and again with the children here at New Hope!



MY TESTIMONY:

Hola, mi nombre es Jhon Centeno Livise. I am 8 years old and in the group of ARDILLAS (younger boys) here in New Hope Children's Home. I have been here now for nearly 3 years. I would like to share with you a little of my testimony...



I was born in the city of Azangaro, Puno. (*Located over 12,500 Feet above sea level, the pueblo of AZANGARO is in the midst of the Andes Mountains... the main languages still spoken there are Quechua and Aymayra*). I grew up there in a small shanty (1 - 2 room home made of adobe) with my mom and dad and three older sisters. I remember my mommy worked in the chackras (small farms) and took care of the animals, my daddy worked in the town hall as a clerk. I always remember playing with my tops and my mommy cooking us Caldo Blanco (Peruvian-style chicken soup).

One day my daddy came home early and told us our mommy had fallen while climbing the hill in the chackra she worked at. They took her to the hospital here in our pueblo and she wasn't getting better. They gave her medicine but it did not help her... when they took her to another hospital far away in Puno, that was the last time I saw her. My daddy came home and told us that our mommy never got better. We lived with my daddy until one day, we were taken to Arequipa and separated

from him. I really did not understand why, but our daddy never came home and never came to look for us. I know he still thinks about me and I think about him all the time. I told my sisters that maybe for Christmas he will come back to look for us. I hope he does.

NOTE: Jhon and his 3 sisters are now here at New Hope. We have been unable to contact their dad and are not sure what has happened to him. Jhon talks about his dad constantly, and misses him greatly. His older sister Liz has told us their dad had a problem with drinking, especially since their mom died. She has taken on a role of a "Mom" to her brother Jhon and younger sisters, a burden she cannot fulfill. Please, pray for this family, they need your prayers so much!
