Greetings

to you all from David and Debbie Bolos and our family in the precious name of our *LORD and Savior Jesus Christ!* "... *And above all things have fervent charity (LOVE) among yourselves: for LOVE shall cover the multitude of sins*". 1 Peter 4:8.

Broken hearts and shattered lives, neglect and abandonment... scars from unspeakable abuse. Children torn from their families before they've even learned to read or write, separated from their brothers and sisters... left in restaurants or on street corners by desperate mothers unable to feed or care for them. We see it

every day... sometimes we are able to help and take the children in... many, many times we just have no room. In one day alone the cases of 6 children were presented to us... how do we help the children we are able to take in? Where do we even start? If I could sum it up in one word it would be *LOVE!* The greatest commandment given to us, the greatest example left for us by Christ can be summed up in this one word... *LOVE!* We love these children in every way, no matter the abuse or horrid scars they carry, no matter their history or the secrets from the past that they hide in their hearts, no matter their defects, their abilities or inabilities... we just love these children and are broken for them. At night we hear their cries and we cry with them, during the day we teach them and spend time and love them... did not our Savior teach us... "*AND ABOVE ALL THINGS HAVE FEVERENT LOVE AMONG YOURSELVES?*" **Is there a commandment greater than this that we must fulfill? Lord... what is the greatest commandment in thy law?**



JUDITH'S STORY...

Hello, my name is Judith Fara. I was born on Nov. 26th, 1990 in a small remote village in the district of Apurimac high in the Andes Mountains. The youngest of 5 children, my mother died when I was just a little girl. My dad quickly remarried and would not care for me. I remember I was sent from one family to another in hopes that someone would just take me in. All I wanted was someone to care for me and to love me. But I was just a burden to everyone. Finally I remember when I was 9 years old my dad could find no one else to take me in. He took me back home, but I lived without love or compassion, I



fought every day just to survive and I learned to live without love... I thought this was normal, not to know love or be loved, until my neighbors told me of a children's home that wanted to help me. I arrived there unsure of what to expect... what can a 9 year old girl who has lost all hope, who has forgotten what it felt to be loved or cared for, expect to find?

I arrived here at New Hope Children's Home, and it was so different that I thought it would be! For the last 11 years have I have lived here. I have found not only love and compassion but learned of a Savior who cares for me! I have finished high-school and hope to enter the university here to study law. My goal is to help other children who are just like I was and to give them hope. As for my dad, I

have learned to forgive him... and though he has never come to visit me, I have visited him several times since I entered here. Please, pray for me, I have many goals and desires, I just need the chance to study so I might help others... *(Judith is hoping to take the entrance exam here and enter into the university. She has worked and saved up a little money, but is in need of help financially. Here, there are no student loans or grants as there are in the states. Please, pray for Judith and several other children from New Hope who have graduated and look to enter the university here.)*

Bread, Cakes and Pantones... For the last several years we have baked our own bread, cakes and Pantones here in our wood-fired bread oven. Every Christmas we also make Peruvian Pantones to sell... and the money we make we use for educational expenses and to take all the children to summer camp in January. Several months ago our bread-mixer gave out and we have not been able to repair it. We desperately need to replace it and also purchase a small gas oven. We have checked here in Arequipa and are able to purchase both a 2-speed Bread Mixer and a 6 Pan Capacity Gas oven for approx. \$3900 for both. We already have orders for over 1000 pantones for Christmas, and the first week of October we need to begin baking. Our teenagers here do all the mixing and baking... and we also use our oven as a ministry to bake bread rolls free of charge for families that live in the villages of Chachani. We still have so much more to report! We just had a precious group of 11 teens and adults from Faith Bible Baptist Church in Eden, NY visit our home for 2 weeks... they were such a blessing! The children here and the Peruvian Christians will never forget the example of love and sacrifice they left with us! A young girl named Audrey, who has been with us doing internship since January, just returned yesterday to the states... she will be so missed by the children! The church here, along with the young people from the home are planning another mission trip to the village of Chivay on the 15th of September. Please, pray for Debbie and I and our children... this past week in Lima Debbie fell and broke her hand and now has a cast up to her elbow. We as a family need wisdom more now than before. Thank you so much for your love and support to our family!
